The Trees of Framsdén

About 30 volunteers from the village worked for 2 days planting the third Agroforestry field of mixed trees behind Framsdén Hall. The grant for labour has been directed into the village specifically towards church roof repairs!

Agroforestry is the growing of trees alongside crops, providing an additional 'vertical' crop either from fruit or nuts or future wood. At the same time the trees provide shelter & shade, habitat for pollinators, birds and wildlife, which all helps to maintain natural balance & healthy growing conditions.

Framsdén trees are growing well despite the shocks of a chaotic climate. The first signs of spring, fresh buds and blossoms provide us with hope for a more balanced growing season for our trees.

We would like to thank Framsdén villagers & especially the Framsdén Woodland Group for all the work they do in Eades Orchard & the village.

Our trees improve air quality, store carbon, provide shelter & habitat for wildlife and we enjoy spending time watching the trees & enjoying the woodland.
